1. Use of Cookies and the Purpose of this policy

1.1 General

The purpose of this Cookie Policy is to provide you with the necessary information regarding Roschier's use of cookies and the storage of such cookies on your device when you access Roschier's website to enable you to choose whether you wish to enable cookies to be placed on your device or not. We use cookies in order to improve the functionality on our website, to monitor and analyze how our visitors use our website and to analyze how efficient our campaigns are.

1.2 What are cookies?

Cookies are small text files that are placed on your computer (or telephone or other device) by websites that you visit. According to applicable law, cookies may only be stored or accessed on your equipment with your consent, except for cookies that are strictly necessary in order to provide the services on our website.

1.3 What are web beacons?

In addition to cookies, Roschier may also use so-called web beacons. A web beacon is a type of electronic image only one pixel large which is embedded into and downloaded with a website, an application or an e-mail with HTML support. A web beacon then provides information about your device, such as the IP address, URL, duration of the visit, web browser and cookies.

1.4 What kind of cookies are used on Roschier's website and for what purpose?

Cookies may be either "**persistent**" cookies or "**session**" cookies. A persistent cookie consists of a text file sent to a web browser, which will be stored by the browser and will remain valid until its specified expiry date (unless deleted by the user before the expiry date). A session cookie, on the other hand, will expire at the end of the user session, when the web browser is closed. The purpose of using the various cookies is outlined below in this Cookie Policy.

Roschier generally divides its cookies into the following two categories (see the tables below for further details on the cookies used on Roschier's website):

- (a) *Strictly necessary cookies*: Roschier uses cookies which are strictly necessary for our website to function properly. These cookies do not collect any personal information. If you choose to reject or deactivate such strictly necessary cookies, you will not be able to use all the functions on our website. The cookies considered strictly necessary are listed in the table of first-party cookies in section 2 below.

(b) *Performance/analysis cookies:* Roschier uses so-called performance/analysis cookies (Google Analytics) to collect information about how users use our website, such as which pages are most frequently visited and if any errors occur. The purpose of this is to evaluate and improve the performance of our website as well as for statistics and our recruitment campaigns.

2. First-Party Cookies

3. How to Manage your Cookie Settings

You can deactivate the use of Google Analytics by following the link above.

Most web browsers also allow you to manage the cookies listed above through the browser settings. By adjusting your web browser, you can avoid receiving cookies. However, this might result in the services on our website not functioning optimally. The method used to block cookies will depend on the web browser used.
